Q. How long have you been in the security industry?

A. I began my career in security in 2009 as a temporary event staff member. Not knowing what the industry offered, I accidentally stumbled into security. After I graduated from college, my mom wanted me to find a real job and encouraged me to apply for a position within the security field. Fast forward: 14 years later, here I am, serving as Vice President at a company I love and respect.

Q. What's your most memorable Marksman Security success story and why?

A. For the last four years, I have had the honor of working with Director of Security Felicia Evans. Seeing how she has developed professionally is inspiring. Ms. Evans was proficient in every position on campus and was ready for the next level. I am proud she is a member of our Atlanta team and look forward to what her future holds.

Q. Why did you join Marksman Security?

A. I joined the Marksman family through a transition at our first property in the Atlanta market. Of course, with transitions, you can stay with your current employer or transition to an incoming company. Several factors sold me on following through with the transition. The first was that the client believed Marksman could give me and my team the chance to hone our talents to elevate, and secondly, I was asked by a member of the Marksman team what I wanted to do. That question was one I wish my then-current employer would have asked. At the time, I wanted to explore Talent Acquisition. Within a year, I was given the opportunity to recruit for the Atlanta office.

A. Commonly, it is thought that security requires strength and physicality to perform the job, but it is deeply rooted in communication. As a small-framed woman with a youthful appearance, people wonder how I successfully enforce rules? The magic is all in how you speak to others, from the public to those we employ. I refer to the old expression, "You catch more flies with honey than vinegar." People tend to respond favorably if you're polite versus being rude. This is a way to de-escalate. Women typically communicate well and offer solutions during difficult situations. In tandem with communication, women also view problems differently and provide unique perspectives.



Mr. Wilkins is a licensed unarmed security officer in the state of Georgia. He actively participates in professional organizations such as BOMA and ASIS.



- 5. **Post After Your Vacation** The fun might be over, but posting your photos to social media when you return gives you more safety and more privacy. Thieves will also be thrown off track.
- 6. Be Aware That Your Photos Have Geotags Your photos have GPS information that reveals when and where you took them. While many social media sites don't disclose this type of information, some websites and apps do, so it's important to double-check before you post pictures online.
